Greetings everyone! Before diving into the tour experience let me first introduce myself as I will be your guide throughout this whole essay. I am Doma Sherpa currently studying in the 6th semester of BBA-BI and I feel very nostalgic while writing down this experience of mine. After I joined Ace, I used to hear from our seniors about the college taking students for a 5-7 days trek. I eagerly looked forward to it from the first semester. But due to covid, our plan was constantly postponed, but finally, after the completion of our 5th semester our plan to Poonhill was concrete and I along with my batch mates, and 3 faculty members started our trek. We were super lucky with the weather. It was warm through the morning and early afternoon, but by the time we reached our teahouse in the late afternoon/evening, the heavens opened up with a huge downpour that cleared the heat away.



Day 1, April 9th: Kathmandu – Nayapul – Tikhedhunga

Our journey from Kathmandu began at 7:00 early in the morning. Driving to the lake city of Pokhara from Kathmandu, the trip began by passing through terraced farms, and rural settlements in isolated areas. At 5:30 pm we reached Nayapul. From Nayapul, it was time to hike! After we passed the checkpoint at Birethanti the road gently climbed to Tikhe Dhunga. It took us approximately 1-2 hours to hike to the overnight lodge at Tikhe Dhunga. Thankfully, it was not a difficult trek that day but enough to wake up our hiking legs. I was exhausted and hungry and rushed down to the dining hall for dinner. After filling our empty stomachs, We all sat around the fire playing Antakshiri and had a wonderful time with our friends. The hotel where we stayed was made of wood and clay, so we would feel the tremors when someone passed by our room or used the stairs. After we all fell asleep my friend Jenisha started to scream at midnight out of nowhere saying “Earthquakeeee aayo earthquake aayo, runn!!”. It was a funny incident from that night that I will never forget.

Day 2 April 10th: Tikedhunga – Ghorepani

The next morning, we woke up for an early tea and breakfast at the hotel and started to walk towards our next destination which was Ghorepani. We were told that the trek would be around eight hours long. After hearing the time it would take, I was stunned for a moment because I had no experience of walking that kind of length. Finally, the long trek began with a steep stone stairway – 3767 steps to be exact (FYI I didn't

count the steps just did some research hehe) up the ridgeline, eventually leading up to Ulleri village. Once you've completed this section of the path, the rest of the trail continues through a scenic area of rhododendron blossoms and old oak forests. As we left Ulleri, I realized the gift God had given us throughout the trek. The route blessed us with natural beauties and gifts of luscious waterfalls, beautifully flowing rivers and various types of plants. We took our time and slowly inched towards our destination as enjoyed whatever we saw on the way. We took plenty of photographs as we walked and finally we could see the beautiful snow-capped mountain peaks to the north. We had all started our trek together but as the time passed, we got separated from our friends and started to walk on our own.

Day 3 April 11: Poonhill- Ghorepani-Tadapani

We started with an early morning wake-up call and began our pre-dawn climb to Poon Hill (10,500 ft) in just about an hour. We saw the best sunrise and magnificent view of the Himalayas like Annapurna South, Bahari Shikhar, Hiuchuli, Nilgiri, Dhaulagiri ranges, Tukucho peak, Annapurna I, II, III, IV, Lamjung Himal, Mt. Manaslu ranges, Machhapuchhre (Fishtail) and others mountains. We grabbed a masala tea from the tea shop nearby and enjoyed the sublime view with our friends. After this unforgettable view, we came back to Ghorepani for breakfast. We then started to trek to Tadapani. This was my best route throughout the whole trek. I and my friend were chased by a buffalo. That experience was something

different. The trail to Tadapani started steep until we crossed the Deurali Pass when the path became more forgiving. From the Deurali Pass, we got a second chance to take in the mountains we saw from Poon Hill. We stayed Overnight in Tadapani.

Day 4 April 12: Tadapani-Ghandruk

We woke up, had our breakfast, and got ready for the day. We continued our hike to Ghandruk through the Baisi Kharka (Buffalo pasture). It was a shorter trek, giving us plenty of time to explore Ghandruk, one of the largest Gurung villages. One of the highlights of the Gurung Culture Museum which gives an insight into the lives of the people. My friends and I tried on the Gurung dress and took many pictures and then we went to visit the Gurung village.
